




OLD SWEDES CHURCH, Wilmington was built in 1698. Once a Swedish Lutheran and now an Episcopal place of worship, it is said to be the oldest Protestant church in North America still in active use.

THE HENRY FRANCIS DU PONT WINTERTHUR MUSEUM consists of more than 100 period rooms covering the American domestic scene from 1640-1840. The showplace located five miles west of Wilmington requires a full day for inspection.




BARRATT'S CHAPEL, "the Cradle of Methodism in the United States", near Frederica, was built in 1780 and the first sacrament was held four years later. Here was located the first Methodist Church in the United States.

THE DICKINSON MANSION near Dover was the boyhood home of John Dickinson, "the Penman of the Revolution". He lived here during the Revolution and while he was Governor of Delaware in 1781. Furnished in antiques of the 18th century, it is now a state museum.

The stately stars-and-stripes furling in the breeze, the inaugural parade of a new President of the United States, or a Governors' convention—in all these scenes, the State of Delaware has the place of honor and a heritage of which all Delawarions should be proud.



An Educational First for Sussex County






Bobby Norwood and David Knowles, Auto Mechanics students, "operate" on a faulty car motor, one of the many phases in checking and repairing.






